6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Peer learning is promoted within and outside the class hours. Team learning is facilitated through project work, on-the-spot study, and educational forums. ICT-enabled teaching-learning process has made students participate actively in the classroom. Meaningful learning is initiated through guided teaching and guided library assignments, group discussion, seminars, debates, quiz, viva, etc.,

The Choice Based Credit System followed at present in the college facilitates partial horizontal movement with regard to choice of subject. The applied component courses are available to students from all subjects. The Language Lab helps the students to develop the language skills within course curriculum and even outside it.

Research is a significant activity of the college. During this academic year 20 research papers were published in National and International Journals. 25 papers were presented in National Seminars and Conferences. 2 research scholars have obtained their Ph. D. from the research centre of our college. 1 minor project was sanctioned by UGC.

The college library has raised its resources periodically with back volumes, new books and journals/magazines have been added to the existing resources in the Library. In order to enhance the resources in e-library, 25 new CDs and DVDs were purchased and added to the e-collection. The membership with British Council Library for the reference service has been renewed and the DELNET service, INFLIBNET and N-List access also continues in this academic year. It was an opportunity for the teachers to select books for their departments. On 10th, rare books collection was exhibited in library reading hall.
